The High Risk/Early Detection Prostate Cancer Clinic is for men who would like Roswell Park Cancer Institute (RPCI) specialists to evaluate their prostate cancer screening results and recommend next steps.

Screening for prostate cancer includes the PSA test and digital rectal exam (DRE). An elevated PSA level may be an indicator of prostate cancer. However, it can be related to other non-cancerous conditions and factors. It's important to get a second opinion and do not rush into unnecessary treatments.

Men should have their primary care physician perform the appropriate screening tests first, before seeking an opinion from RPCI.

The National Comprehensive Cancer Network (NCCN) recommends that men may need to receive a baseline PSA test as early as age 40. This is particularly important for those at high risk. The decision to participate in an early detection program for prostate cancer should be discussed with your doctor.

High Risk Groups Include:

- African Americans
- Men with a family history of prostate cancer
- Men with a confirmed BRCA1 or BRCA2 genetic mutation
